### This Week:

This week in Nursery, the children have been continuing to explore our topic 'How many colours in a rainbow?'. We have begun our new story 'Egg drop'. We have enjoyed learning about eggs, expanding our vocabulary to use verbs such as 'squeeze'. We have also discussed dreams and aspirations for the future.

At our mark making table, the children have been drawing pictures of flowers, identifying and labelling their features such as leaf and stem. This is helping to develop their pencil control and expand their vocabulary. Children have also been making rainbow collages using paper plates and multi-coloured tissue paper. On our easel, children have been painting rainbows using our rainbow song to remember the correct order.

On our maths table we have been continuing to match quantity of number to the number representation on ducks. This helps children to understand the value of number.

#### Reminders
